Wise Guys is an adolescent pregnancy prevention program designed for young men between the ages of 10 and 15, which aims at promoting sexual responsibility in that population. In April, the National Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy honored the Family Life Council's Wise Guys program in recognition of its leadership in helping young men reduce their risk of unplanned parenthood and sexually transmitted diseases.

According to data gathered from past Wise Guys participants, boys from the program showed significant gains in areas of knowledge such as sexuality and contraception, improvement in communication with parents and more positive sex role attitudes. Currently, the program is offered in most Guilford County middle schools and several community locations.
