

United Cornerstone will hold Holy Week Revival

United Cornerstone Missionary Baptist Church will hold its annual Holy Week Revival, beginning Sunday, March 10, at 4 p.m. and continuing through Thursday, March 14. The guest speaker will be Rev. J.R. Freeman, pastor of United Institutional Baptist Church in Greensboro.

Freeman is a native of Raleigh. He accepted Christ at the age of 7, and was baptized in the Fayetteville Street Baptist Church (now First Metropolitan Baptist Church) of Raleigh, where he served as a Sunday school superintendent and a junior deacon.

Freeman acknowledged God's call at an early age and preached his initial sermon in 1981 while a student at N.C. Agricultural and Technical State University (A&T) of Greensboro, where he earned a bachelor of science degree in counseling and social work. Continuing his studies, he received a master of divinity degree from Virginia Union University in Richmond, Va., and in 1995 he graduated from Howard University School of

Divinity in Washington, D.C., with a doctor of ministry degree.

Freeman is actively involved in denominational as well as civic and community work. He serves on the Ministers Council of the General Baptist State Convention of North Carolina and as vice moderator and chairman of the Ordination Council for the Rowan Baptist Association. He organized the Underground Railroads to the Polls voter registration and transportation to the polls project. He has served on the board of directors for the East Market Street Redevelopment Corp., Family Advocacy Council and the United Community Development Corp., a 501C3 initiative organized through United Institutional Baptist Church.

Freeman also organized a fund-raiser for the United Negro College Fund through

community churches in support of Bennett College, a historically black college in Greensboro, and the church

won honors as "Church of the Year" for its continued support of the Greensboro NAACP.

Freeman is married to the former Felicia McGhee of Clinton, N.C., an attorney, and they have two sons, Brandon Rayton and Desmond Jarrell. "Rescue the Perishing" is the theme for Dr. J. Emmanuel Baptist Church will celebrate its annual S.W. Mack Sr. Memorial Scholarship Fund Service on Sunday March 10. The 11 a.m. speaker will be Dr. Harold L. Martin Sr.

Martin is the 11th chief administrator and the seventh chancellor of Winston-Salem State University. Before his appointment as chancellor, Martin served in several administrative positions at N.C. A&T State University, including vice chancellor for academic affairs, dean of the College of Engineering, and chair of electrical engineering, having risen in faculty rank from assistant to full professor.

Martin has written or co-authored numerous articles, made numerous presentations at national and international conferences, and has been recognized as The Chronicle's "Man of the Year," and the Winston-Salem Business Journal's "10 to Watch." He has an

extensive background in electrical engineering, higher education administration, strategic planning, curriculum design, funded research and fund-raising, and business and industry consulting.

A native of Winston-Salem, Martin, was educated in the public schools of Winston-Salem/Forsyth County and obtained a bachelor of science degree in electrical engineering and a master of science degree in electrical engineering from N.C. A&T State University. He earned a Ph.D. degree in electrical engineering at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University. He is married to Davida Wagner Martin and they have two sons, Harold Jr. and Walter.
