 Winston-Salem Beauticians Association Chapter 2 continues to serve in our community, using some of the Helping Hands Members, a group within the beauticians association.

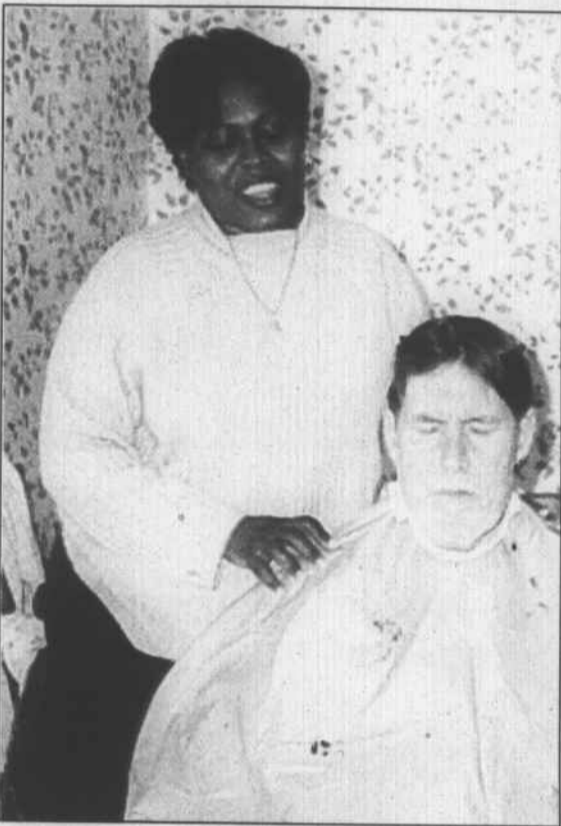

All Achievers sang "The National Achievers' Hymn," directed by Betty Hannon. Valerie Harris gave the closing prayer, followed by adjournment.

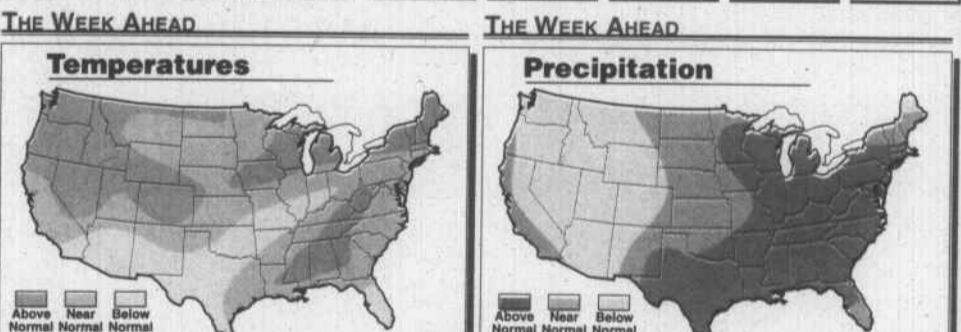
Southeast Regional Director Jeannette T. Lewis was so proud of the efforts put into Founders Day 2002.
