Forsyth County's Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) announces the availability of a contract for fiscal year 2002-2003. These funds must be used to provide services to juveniles that are at-risk of delinquency.

A Contract is available for up to \$72,000 to a Medicaid and Healthchoice provider to deliver psychological evaluation, assessment, counseling and treatment services to juvenile court referred youth. The service contract must provide on-site services at the Department of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (DJJDP) and at Visions Work Alternative Day program. Additional services must be provided to court referred youth at the direction of the DJJDP.
