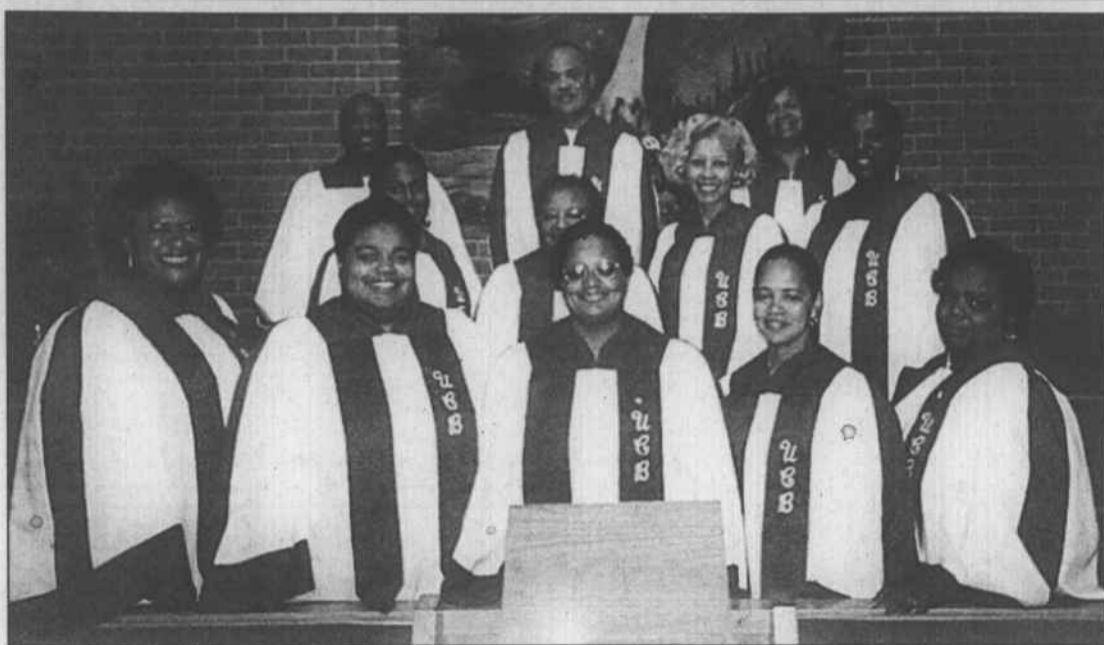

Dr. David Emmanuel Goatley will be the 11 a.m. worship service speaker for the missionary department at Emmanuel Baptist Church Sept. 22.

Goatley is the executive secretary-treasurer of the Lott Carey Foreign Mission Convention (a global Christian missions agency devoted to building a better world through Christian missions) and the executive director of Lott Carey International (a relief, development and advocacy agency committed to empowering marginalized people and communities around the world).

As the chief executive officer of these organizations, he is responsible for the vision, execution and expansion of holistic programs of ministry, health and education in Africa, Asia, the Caribbean and South America.

A native of Louisville, Ky., Goatley is a graduate of the University of Louisville (A.A.S. and B.S.) and the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary (M.Div. and Ph.D.) and was ordained for the Gospel ministry by First Baptist Church, Eminence, Ky.

His professional experience includes successful tenures in data and telecommunications, denominational leadership, urban ministries, the pastorate and higher education.

He is the author of several published articles and one book, "Were You There?: Godforsakenness in Slave Religion" (Orbis Books, 1996).
