NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING BY FORSYTH COUNTY

Forsyth County will conduct a public hearing on the proposed Rural Operating Assistance Program (ROAP) Application to be submitted to the North Carolina Department of Transportation by August 15, 2008 on behalf of Forsyth County. The public hearing will be held on Monday, July 28th, 2008 at 7:30 p.m. in the Forsyth County Commissioners' Meeting Room on the Fifth Floor of the Forsyth County Government Center located at 201 North Chestnut Street, Winston-Salem, NC, 27101. Forsyth County will provide auxiliary aids and services under ADA for disabled persons who wish to participate in the hearing. Anyone requiring special services should contact the Clerk to the Board of Commissioners at 703-2020 within 48 hours prior to the hearing so that arrangements can be made.

The programs included in the ROAP application are:

1. The Elderly and Disabled Transportation Assistance Program (EDTAP) provides elderly and disabled transportation services for counties. This transportation assistance allows individuals to reside for longer periods in their homes, thereby enhancing their quality of life. For the purpose of EDTAP, an elderly person is defined as one who reaches the age of 60 or more years. A disabled person is defined as one who has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activity, an individual who has a record of such an impairment, or an individual who is regarded as having such an impairment; and

2. The Employment Transportation Assistance Program (EMTAP) is intended to provide operating assistance for transitional Work First, Workforce Development Programs, and general public assistance employment transportation needs. These funds will be used to support the employment transportation needs of individuals that are not eligible to receive benefits from the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Program.

The period of performance for the proposed Rural Operating Assistance Program Application is July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009. The proposed FY 2008-2009 individual program totals are:
