The Color Purple was nominated for 11 Oscars. The novel was
challenged and/or banned for troubling ideas about race relations, violence, negative images of black men and more. Rated PG-13. Oct. 6 at 7 pm.

Kurt Vonnegut's 1969 classic, Staughterhouse Five was made into a movie in 1972 and won multiple awards. The novel was challenged and/or banned for sexual scenes, violence, ethnic slurs, negative portrayals against women and more. Rated R. Oct. 13 at

Vladimir Nabokov's Lotte was adapted for the screen in 1962 and was nominated for an Oscar for best screenplay. The book was banned as obscene in France, England, Argentina and New Zealand. Not rated. Oct. 20 at 6 pm.
