Herb: You're talking about Tarvaris Jackson. I think they're doing him like that because he's black. It somehow doesn't matter when a caucasian comes from a smaller school. He's smart enough to pick it up and everything. But they have something to say about him because he's African American. Anthony: (Laughs.) Herb Miller tells it like it is. Not like it was or should be. (Laughs.) Herb: (Laughs.) Oh yeah. And, you know I'm still mad at you for not putting me on that All-County JV team back in the day

Herb: Ah, it's just time for a change. I'm getting older. It's about time for me to start looking for a job. You can't go in nobody's office with dreads.


Anthony: OK. How are things going in the classroom? Herb: I'm good in the Anthony: (Smiles.) I know you're still not talking about that. That was votes, man.
