Performing again this year will be the Library's ultra-talented youth services staff who will do hilarious skits, sing-along songs and fascinating stories. Captain Jim, the pirate magician (www.captainjimismagic.com), will also be on hand offering up several incredible magical illusions, and Fernando's Puppet Show will provide entertainment for young and old alike. Stop by the Kick-off to sign up for Summer Reading fun or you can sign up at any Library location beginning June 13th.

Kids who sign up will be given a reading log to track the number of hours they read from the kick-off through the conclusion of summer reading on July 25th. Once reading logs are completed, they can be redeemed for prizes at your local Forsyth County Public Library location. 


Learn How to Can & Preserve
