Englishman eventually became the captain of a slave ship. During a storm at sea, Newton experienced the presence and grace of God, eventually abandoning his captaincy to become pastor of the Parish Church of St. Peter and St. Paul in Olney, England and a strong advocate

for the abolishment of slavery. He became one of England's most beloved hymn writers. His hymns also include "Day of Judgment! Day of Wonders!" Written by the late Dan Neidermyer, who directed the 1982 movie "First Fruits" about the first Moravian missions. Nelson travels nationally and internationally portraying various Biblical roles, including Jesus in Passion Play productions and in re-enactments for tours in the Holy Lands.
