
Napper is married to Linda Scott and they are parents of six children: Samuel, Ja'Warren, Scott, Corey, Diane and Crystal.



Background Reading: Revelation 22:12-17

Lesson Scripture: John 4:7-15, 23-26, 28-30

Lesson Aims: To recognize that God's standards aren't like the world's; to appreciate invitation to all; and to become more like Him daily.

Background: Samaria is a region equivalent to a country. North of the Dead Sea and west of the Jordan River, the region was avoided by devout Jews since the time of the Assyrian conquest of Israel (721 BC). This was the northern kingdom after Solomon. When the Assyrians deported the Jews, they brought in foreigners to live there. Those foreigners in turn married the remaining Jews, creating a "mixed race." The Jews in the south (Judah/Judea) looked
