Lesson: Paul calls the converted Gentiles to when they remember were outsiders. His words also conjure up the past for the Jews as well. It is important that they acknowledge where they were before Salvation as compared to now. An outward show (the Jews) means nothing to God if the heart hasn't changed. His love for all is shown by sending Jesus to redeem humanity. Because of Jesus, the barriers no longer exist. Everyone has equal access to the Father.

All human divisions (attitudes, cultures. decrees, races, gender and enmities) are no longer valid reasons to exclude those who are different. The Christ brings unity with each other and with God. This is the fruit of the cross! It did what no other power could do. Therefore the cross shouldn't be taken lightly. Paul concludes with the notion that the foreigners, aliens or outsiders, and the privileged,

Unity in the body brings to mind an old hymn by Samuel J. Stone (1834-1900) that says: "The church's one foundation is Jesus Christ her Lord.
