The Temple's foundation wasn't laid yet but they celebrated the Feast of Tabernacle (Booths) after Yom Kippur for five days. This celebration commemorates their wandering in the wilderness. Money, food, drink and oils are collected to pay the craftsmen and to bring the cedar logs needed to lay the Temple's foundation. Everything that's done is in accordance with Cyrus' decree.

2, under the leadership, mentioned earlier, approximately 49,897 people returned, along with a host of horses, mules, camels and donkeys.

Lesson: The seventh month of the Jewish calendar is Tishri (September-October). During one of their most sacred months, three major feasts occur. The Feast of Trumpets (Rosh Hashbanah) is the beginning of their civil new year. The tenth day of Tishri is the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur). On that day the high priest makes confession for the entire community's sins and enters the Most Holy Place with the blood of reconciliation. See Leviticus 16:15. Recognizing the importance of Tishri, the people in unity assemble to rebuild the Altar. Because of the nature of what they are about to do, the priests come first then the civil leaders. The Altar is erected on the original foundation, which sym-
