First Lady of Gospel Shirley Caesar brought down the house on May 16 with her stirring performance at United Metropolitan Missionary Baptist Church.

Caesar regaled a crowd of more than 700 during the more than two hour-long concert, which was offered to the local community free of charge by Forsyth Jail and Prison Ministries. During the concert, a love offering was collected in support of the Ministry, which has a 35-plus year hi tory of providing Christianfocused programming and support to inmates in Forsyth County and their families.

A veteran performer and member of the North Carolina Gospel Music Hall of Fame, Caesar cut her teeth as a solo gospel performer in 1966 and has been lighting up stages the world over with her message of hope and salvation ever since. Rev. Victoria F. Hanchell has released a new book, 'Women of Wisdom-WOW! 24 Karat Nuggets of Wisdom




