Scam artists continually find new ways to fleece the elderly. Follow these tips to protect yourself!

- Be suspicious of unsolicited deals for goods or services that are much cheaper than the going rate.
- Don't trust strangers who contact you requesting money or personal information.
- Don't trust any unsolicited gifts, prizes or sweepstakes that require you to send money or personal information in order to collect.
- ALWAYS be suspicious of any offer that pressures you to act immediately.

- Some scammers use your Facebook page to get names of relatives, then contact you posing as that person and requesting money. Never send a dime until you confirm their story with someone else who knows them.
- NEVER give personal bank account numbers, Social Security numbers, Medicare numbers or cell phone numbers in response to an unsolicited call, email or text message.
- ALWAYS get a written estimate for car and home

repairs. Be suspicious of any home repair or tree contractors who show up unsolicited at your door, especially after a storm.

- Always be suspicious when someone you do not know offers you something for nothing.
- Protect your computer.
 NEVER click on links in unsolicited emails.
