## East Forsyth features promising cast of newcomers hungry to win tournament

East Forsyth is young and inexperienced with five freshmen, six sophomores and no returnees from last year's team that finished 19-5 overall and 10-0 in the Piedmont Triad 4-A Conference. A year ago, the Eagles finished third in the Lash-Chronicle tournament. This year, they are the No. 3 seed.

Even though it's still early in the season, it's clear that East Forsyth will be led by a promising group of sophomores who played on the ninth-grade team last year. Coach Rodney Minor will lean heavily on

Tanis Samuels and Sayyid Dalton to set the tone and tempo for this group.

There's no doubt that Samuels and Dalton are the cornerstones.
