

**CUTTING TIMBER.**  
If oak, hickory, or chestnut be felled in August, in the second running of the sap, and barked, quite a large tree will season perfectly, and even the twigs will remain sound for years; whereas, that cut in winter, and remaining until the next fall, (as thick as your wrist) will be completely sap-rotten, and will be almost unfit for any purpose. The body of oak split into rails will not last more than 10 or 12 years. Chestnut will last longer, but no comparison to that cut in August.—Hickory cut in August is not subject to be worm eaten, and lasts a long time for fencing. When I began farming in 1802, it was the practice to cut timber for post fencing in the winter. White oak posts and black oak rails, cut at that time, would not last more than 10 or 12 years. In 1808, I began cutting fence timber in August. Many of the oak rails cut that year are yet sound, as well as most of the chestnut. If the bark is not taken off this month, it will of itself peel off the 23 or 31 year, and leave the tree perfectly sound. The tops of the tree are also more valuable for fuel than when cut in winter or spring. I advise young farmers to try the experiment, and if post fences do not last twice as long, I forfeit all my experience as worthless.—*Correspondence of Rural American.*

ness, not in luxury; but, rather, you will be sanctified by work, by care, by antagonism, by affliction; you will be the Christian anywhere and everywhere; you will cheerfully breast the wild drift of persecution for the sake of the discipline it brings; you will realize the dignity of personal accountability to Christ, independent of family or sectarian prestige, as the cedar which draws and uses power in its appointed place, uncompromised with any other vegetation under the sun; you will send your highest thoughts in praise to God, and diffuse the incense of your love to heaven & earth the same; you will so grow in Christ Jesus that the winds of false doctrine will howl harmlessly by, without dislodging a thought or an affection of the soul, as the wild mountain winds pass by the cedar without detaching a leaf; you will even be stirred to sing psalms of thanksgiving by the very influences which shall blast the hopes of the ungodly forever. If converted and renewed in the image of Christ, you will grow stronger with every added day, and be developed the more by every adversity, bereavement, loss, and sorrow, enlarging in heart and mind and soul, as you live and are tempted, standing firm on the Rock till you die. And then, being dead, your memory shall speak to succeeding generations, as the fragrance of the cedar breathes evermore when its foliage has departed, and its branches have been laid low in the dust.

**A NEW SENSATION—THE ELEPHANT BEETLE.**  
A Nevada paper is responsible for the following beetle story, which goes ahead of anything we have yet read in the fish or snake line. It appears that, in addition to the plague of a plurality of wives, Utah is also afflicted with a visitation of the elephant beetle. A person who returned from the neighborhood of Salt Lake last week, saw myriads of them covering the earth with their shining brownish black bodies, and destroying everything which they met in their path. Even small animals, he was informed by the ill-fated residents, did not escape the voracity of these hordes; their bodies were crushed upon and wounded cruelly with the powerful antennae until they fell down exhausted by their struggles and loss of blood, when they were fastened upon by thousands and devoured. The entire carcass of a sheep was eaten and the bones picked clean in two minutes and a quarter; and it is said that a dead ox would be gobbled up by them in a quarter of an hour. So ferocious are these giant beetles that mothers are afraid to let their little children go out of the house unattended by a grown person. In their frequent bloody con-quests the wounded are devoured on the instant. Our informant says they are about four inches long, with legs three inches long; their antennae are stiff, sharp, and forty four inches long; they have a short tail, armed with a powerful horn, and their shells are so hard that the weight of a man will scarcely crush them. They are very irritable at times, and jump with the agility of fleas. No other species of the beetle possesses their faculty of uttering a loud sound, which, made by thousands of them at once, resembles the braying of a band of jackasses. Their noise terrified the horses of our informant and his companion, which could not be kept up on the plain, so great was their fright. On one occasion, while they were riding in a valley that was black with beetles, and crushing under their hoofs, when their hard cases would crack with a report like a rifle, the fierce insects showed a disposition to attack the horses, and fairly drove them out of the field. We were informed that a scientific man in Salt Lake City was collecting specimens of this formidable elephant beetle for transmission to the various learned institutions of the country. It is very likely also that the elephant beetle may soon be exhibited on Broadway, immediately after the excitement about the "headless rooster" passed off. We want enough of them at least to imitate the bray of one jackass.—*Scientific American.*
