Sickle Cell

Committee Has First

Meeting

Preliminary recommenda tions from the first meeting of the HEW Sickle Cell Ane mia Advisory Committee for expanded research and community - service programs against this chronic disease of black children and young adults have now been an nounced

In summarizing the results of the meeting, Mrs. Ruth Aikens, Committee Chair man, said that at this time the Committee favors an approximately equal division of available funds between re search and community - service activities.

Mrs. Aikens also characterized the \$6 million to be allofor SCA research the fiscal year as during only— a beginning toward a maximum-effort program to control sickle cell anemia and, ultimately, to eradicate the disease as a major cause of disability and death.

The Committee will - meet again within approximately 60 days, Mrs. Aikens added, to develop detailed recommen dations concerning program goals and the emphasis to be placed on each.

The SCA Advisory Committee met August 13 at the National Institutes of Health, Maryland, with Dr. Merlin K. DuVal, Jr., HEW Assistant Secretary for Health and Scientific Affairs; Dr. Robert Q. Marston, NIH Di rector, Dr. Robert L. Ring ler, Deputy Director of the National Heart and Lung In stitute and SCA program co ordinator for DHEW; Dr. Vernon Wilson, Administrator from the Health Services and Mental Health Administration; and other federal health agency officials. The purpose of the meeting was to consider plans for carrying out the expanded SCA program recom mended by President Nixon in his February 18 Health Message to the Congress. "This Committee

unique," Dr. DuVal said, "in that it marks the first time that a national level advisory committee, reporting directly to the Secretary of HEW, has been established to focus attention on a government specific disease problem and to recommend how the gov ernment can and should use its resources to attack a dis ease that afflicts an estimated

50,000 American blacks." President identified sickle cell anemia, an in herited blood disorder found almost exclusively among blacks as a high-priority disease target and called for a \$5 million increase in federal expenditures for research on this disorder during the cur rent fiscal year. The National Heart and Lung Institute was assigned responsibility for co-ordinating this joint ef fort. The NHLI appropriation will contain the FY 1972 funds earmarked for this special program, but these funds may also be drawn upon by other Institutes of NIH. HSMHA, and possibly other participating federal agencies.

The Sickle Cell Anemia Ad visory Committee was es tablished by Secretary Elliot L. Richardson to provide ad vice and assistance in planning and carrying out this program from distinguished professional and lay leaders especially knowledgeable about the problems of sickle cell disease.
