

Glasson Is No Fluke On Gridirons

When number eight-two trots on the gridiron to play football, the opposition should be alert.

James Arthur Glasson, Jr., a sophomore at Fayetteville State University and offensive tight-end for the McDougal-coached Broncos, can play this position very well and is improving daily.

"James is one of our fine receivers this year, although our team is blessed with many good receivers this season. He is very dependable and has a fine pair of hands," says Coach Raymond A. McDougal.

Glasson says that his biggest thrill at FSU so far was being able to start the last game of his freshman year at tight-end position. However, the glue-fingered youngster has provided some early fireworks this season by snagging some important passes in the Bronco's opener against Federal City College.

At least on two occasions in the contest with Federal City College, which was won by FSU 45-14, the second year tight-end kept some important Bronco drives alive with

spectacular catches which left Bronco fans applauding.

Glasson is quite familiar with the game of football. He has been playing since his freshman year in high school. A graduate of Pine Forest High School, he was a member of the championship team in

his junior year and co-champion during his last year in high school.

When asked how he felt the team would do this year, the tight-end said, "I believe that Fayetteville State University will be a contender in the CIAA conference if the team works together."

Smith at Memorial Stadium here; Livingstone tangling with North Carolina Central in Durham; Fayetteville taking on Fort Valley State College in Fort Valley, and the Virginia Commonwealth University hosting Virginia Union in Richmond.

Winston-Salem State is idle.

The Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference will have South Carolina State playing Howard University in Washington, D. C. North Carolina A&T will travel to Tallahassee, Fla. to engage Florida A&M University in a non-conference tilt.
