Joseph Green Named **CMS Safety Director**

Appointed by recent action CMS Board of the Education, Green will assume his new duties when a replacement is found for him at Hawthorne.



Food Town Stores opened its twentieth super market unit Wednesday, (March 13) in Kannapolis.

Located in the Cabarrus Shopping City on Cannon Boulevard, the 15,400 square foot unit will be the second Food Town Store in Kannapolis.

Food Town, termed one of the fastest growing super market chains in the Southeast, has seen sales grow from \$5 million in 1967 to over \$71 million in 1973. The super market generates its sales volume through the use of "over 5,500 every day low prices, most at or near wholesale cost," according to Food Town president Ralph W. Ketner.

Four additional stores are scheduled to be opened during Albemarle. the vear: Greensboro, Gastonia, and Charlotte.

The company's warehouse in Salisbury is being doubled to 266,000 square feet, and the former warehouse is being converted to a distribution center for dairy, frozen fe ds and produce. 66,000 of the building's 84,000 square feet will be placed under refrigeration.
