Hatchett and Cunningham Associates, a minority recruiting consultant firm, has opened its Charlotte offices in Suite 755 of the East Independence Plaza building. The firm, operated by partners, William Cunningham and Phillip Hatchett, recently moved to Charlotte from Greensboro, N.C. They were organized in June of 1973.

As far as is known, theirs is the only minority owned recruiting firm in the Southeast which concentrates on recruitment of professional skilled minorities.
