taxed at rates applicable to a married worker with three dependents fell 0.3 percent from September, seasonally adjusted.

Over the year, real spendable earnings were down 4.9 percent owing to the 4.1 percent decline in real weekly earnings and a 0.9 percent increase in the effect of taxes.

The Hourly Earnings Index in dollars of constant purchasing power was 106.6 in October, seasonally adjusted, 0.1 percent lower than in September. Compared with a year ago, the index is 2.7 percent lower, the index excludes the effects of overtime in manufacturing and of inter-industry shifts, such as the shift of workers between high-wage industries.
