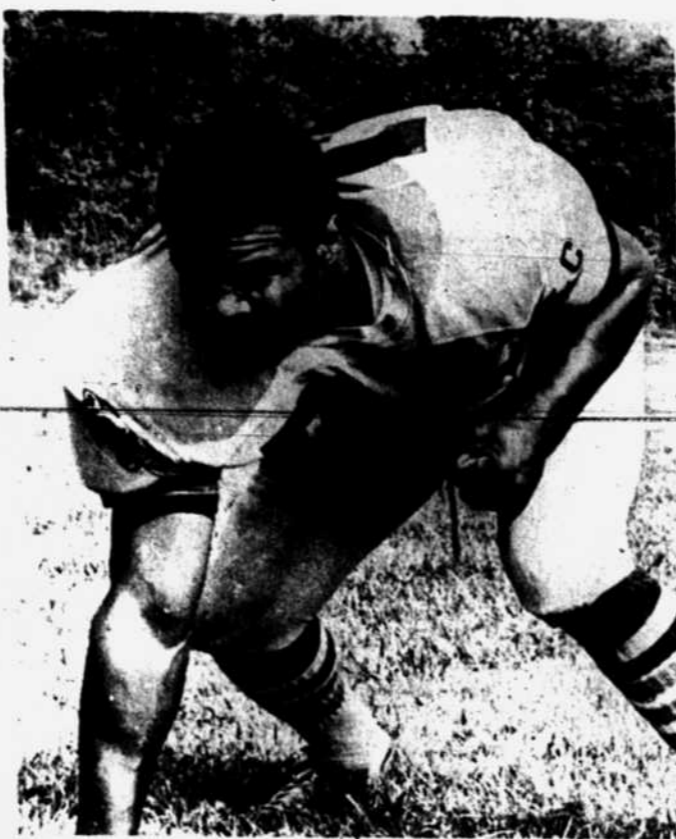

MEAC Best Tangles With SWAC Top 5's

...the opening night of the doubleheader. Friday, December 13, Maryland, Eastern Shore plays awesome Jackson State in the 7 p.m. opener, followed by the 9 p.m. featured matchup of the nation's two leading small-college five last year - the Morgan Bears and the Alcorn Braves. The next evening - Saturday, December 14 - the two MEAC clubs will switch opponents with the Hawks from Eastern Shore engaging Alcorn in the opener and Nat Frazier's Morgan five matching up against Paul Covington's Jackson State team, reputed to be "loaded" with super personnel.

Three legitimate All-Americans will appear in the Doubleheader. Playing in the two-night inter-conference matchups along with Morgan State's Marvin "Eraser" Webster, a unanimous pre-season selection on virtually every major college All-America team, will be Jackson State's Gene Short, a 6-7 junior who played on the U.S. team in the World Basketball Championship last summer; and 6-6 Alfred Milton, an NAAI all-tourney choice at the Kansas City Nationals.

Holman, Three Bears Receive CIAA Honors

Livingstone College head football coach Baxter D. Holman was named Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association coach of the year last week. In 2 years at the helm of the Salisbury, N. C. team, Holman's record is 16-2-1. At the same time three Livingstone players were named to the All-CIAA team. Andrew Cooney, a 180-pound sophomore from Hialeah, Fla. was named the team's kicking specialist, while juniors Samuel Branch, from Detroit, Mich. and Johnny Miller, from Ellerbe, N. C. were named defensive end and defensive tackle, respectively.

Livingstone posted its best record in the school's history this season, winning nine games and losing two. Surprisingly one defensive player was named to the all-conference team. The Livingstone defense led the nation, among small colleges, in both total defense and rushing defense. Johnny "Smiley" Miller, son of Mr. and Mrs. Willie Miller of Ellerbe, also received honorable mention on the Greensboro Daily News All-Collegiate Team. Miller was a leader on the Livingstone College Fighting Bears' defense that limited eleven opponents to 53 yards rushing and 67.5 yards passing. In the Fayetteville State University game, Johnny had 15 unassisted tackles, blocked a field goal attempt, and recovered a fumble that led to the winning touchdown. Coach Holman said that "Miller is the best football player that I have ever coached."

Holland Grabs FSU Scoring Lead

They call him "Bean" and he is mean when it comes to playing basketball for the Fayetteville State University (N. C.) basketball team. Coach Otis Hawkins recruited 6-9 forward-center Walt Holland from a community college at Baltimore, Maryland and in the season opener for the Broncos he

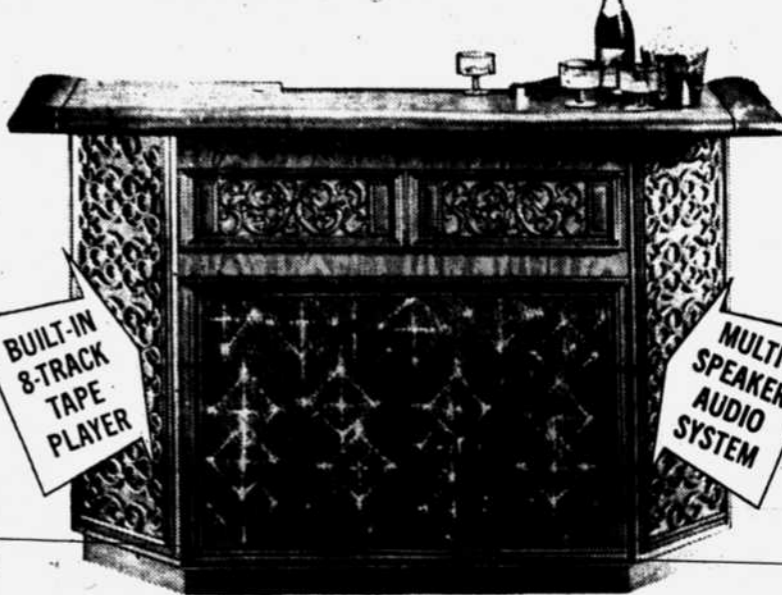

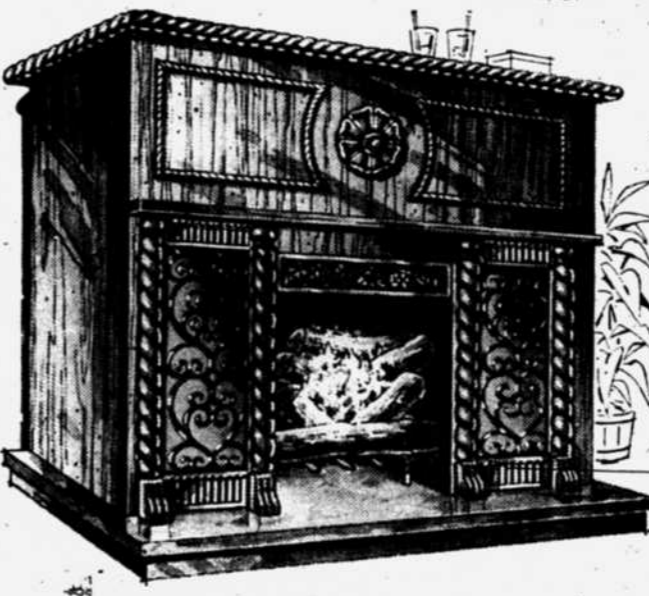

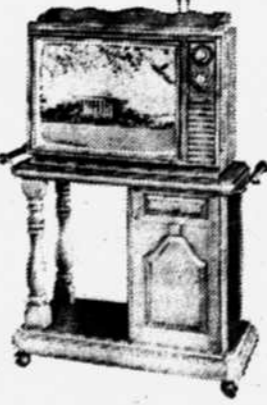
