## Safe Driving Tips For The Holidays

.The Christmas season goes hand in hand with traditions. Many of these traditions involve attending parties where alcoholic beverages are ser-ved. The Highway Patrol would like for this to be a safe holiday season and offers a few tips for your safety.

.. If your party includes alcoholic beverages, identify the drivers as your guest arrive and limit them to oneounce drink per hour. A oneounce drink containing 90 proof hard liquor consumed by a person weighing 150 pounds will cause a blood alcohol concentration of 1.02 percent. If their drinks are limited to , not more than one per hour. there should not be an accumulation of alcohol in the blood which causes intoxica-

The safest practice is not to drink if you plan to drive, or if

you drink, let a non-drinking companion take over the driving responsibility. Even a small amount of alcohol in the blood can reduce coordination, slow reflexes or lead to overconfidence which may cause a serious accident.

.. If you see a vehicle appearing to be driven by an intoxicated driver make a note of the description, license number, location, direction of travel and report it to the local
