Other intercity visits will be held throughout the remainder of the school year for principals to learn about other school systems and share ex-

Each city has seven participants including five principals, a local college coordinator and a school system coordinator.

believe that there are techniques to solve any problem if the necessary information is gathered," he continued.

A native of Salisbury, Miller graduated from A&T State University, spent four years in service, then received his masters degree from Penn State in 1950. "I started work on my Ph.D. but I met this pretty little girl and married her and never did complete it," he laughed.

The "pretty little girl" he refers to is the former Sadie Moragne of Bordeaux, S.C., a teacher in the Charlotte-Mecklenburg system. They have one son, Skip, attending the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Hawkins who taught at West Charlotte was chairman of the math department before succeeding Miller as assistant principal, was named principal of Independence three years ago. He graduated from Livingstone College and has an M.A. from Michigan State University and a M.Ed. from the University of North Caro-lina - Charlotte. "Attendance is my concern, also," he said. "I'm concerned with how much absenteeism there is before a youngster reaches the age of sixteen, then how many of those same youngsters we lose after they pass the mandatory attendance age. I'd also like to know how many of them come back to school in the adult education program." He, too, is in the preliminary stages of data gathering and didn't wish to hazard any guesses as the reasons why of the phenome-non of absenteeism. "I'm only sure that a student can't learn if they're not in the classroom and I'd like to get to the bottom of the situation and see if there isn't something concrete that can be done about the problem," he concluded.

Hawkins is married to the former Lola Patterson, who teaches in the Fayetteville public schools and they have a ten year old daughter Kimber-
