Southern Rodeo Finals To Feature Bull Chariot Race

One of the extra added attractions of the Southern Rodeo Finals will be an exciting Bull Chariot Race.

This will be an exhibition contest only and not a part of regular competition. The event will feature two fighting Bulls each hooked to a Special Built Chariot.

The Bulls are placed in the Bucking Chute and each of them has a padded saddle with a ball type trailer hitch in the middle.

The Special built Chariots are hooked to the hitch in such a manner that the bulls have complete freedom of movement. They can run, jump, kick, or move in any direction.

The object of the contest is for the Chariot "drivers" to coax their cantankerous animals across the finish line at the far end of the Arena.

After crossing the finish line the drivers must then trip the Quick Release which separates the Bull from the Chariot and then scramble to safety—which is sometimes a task more difficult than winning the Race.

The Rodeo will feature eight competition events; Bareback Bronc Riding, Calf Roping, Saddle Bronc Riding, Cowgirls Barrel Racing, Steer Wrestling, Team Roping, Wild Brahma Bull Riding and Cowgirls Goat Typing.

The "Keynote" of the entire rodeo is "Total Family Entertainment." The Rugged contest events are spiced with colorful feature performers, clowns, special music, and spotlighted production numbers.

Performances are synchronized to run approximately 2½ hours including a 15 minute intermission.

Brown Succeeds Benjamin Hooks

The President has announced the nomination of Tyrone Brown, of Washington, D.C., to be a member of the Federal Communications Commission for the unexpired term of seven years from July 1, 1972. He would succeed Benjamin L. Hooks, resigned.

The Federal Communications Commission is the United States Government agency which regulates television, ra-

dio, cable and satellite communication.

Brown was born November 5, 1942, in Norfolk, Virginia. He received an A.B. from Hamilton College in 1964 and an LL.B. from Cornell Law School in 1967.

Brown was law clerk to Chief Justice Earl Warren in 1967, and an associate with a Washington law firm from 1968 to 1970. He was a special

investigator for the President's Commission on Campus Unrest in 1970.
