

QUESTION:

I like my hair dyed, but the color I want calls for pre-lightening. My Beautician says my hair won't stand it. What can I do?

ANSWER:

There are new professional techniques whereby hair can be carried from deep black to most pastel shades without prelightening, also in half the time. This will expose the hair 50 percent less time, and will minimize the damaging effects, also saving time and money. Ask your Beautician to look into this system or check with some one who does it.
