Televises "Frosty

The Snowman"

Frosty, that "happy, jolly soul" whose old silk hat full of magic has turned him into a musical Christmas legend, demonstrates his unique snowmanship in the popular holiday perennial "Frosty the Snowman," animated musical special, narrated by Jimmy Durante, to be broadcast Saturday, December 10, at 8:30 p.m. on WBTV, Channel 3.

Comedian Jackie Vernon provides the voice for Frosty on the musical Christmas fable, originally broadcast on the Network December 7, 1969. The special, based on the popular song of the same title by Jack Rollins and Steve Nelson, about the happy-go-lucky snowman with the corn-cob pipe, the button nose and two eyes made out of coal, features Billy DeWolfe as the voice of the villainous Professor Hinkle, a magician whose stovepipe topper transforms the lifeless snow figure into an enchanting song-and-dance man.

Pursued by the hatless professor and rising temperatures, Frosty set off for the North Pole to keep from melting. En route, the indomitable snowman weathers a whirl of adventures and overcomes the threat of evaporation.

"A Study Of Depression" Is WBTV Special

A look at the most widespread mental-mood disorder in this country, mental depression, will be aired Monday, December 12 at 9:30 p.m. on WBTV, Channel 3. Entitled

"Through Blues Colored Glasses," the program's purpose is to help the ordinary adult learn to understand, to recognize, and to deal with this inner affliction.

Depression is regarded by some as the only truly fatal emotional disorder, because the person's drive to survive too often gives way to suicidal wishes. "Through Blues Colo-

red Glasses" approaches the problem in a positive way, pointing out the fact that knowledge, treatment, and understanding are now available that didn't exist a short time ago.

The experts interviewed for the program include Dr. Gordon Burnett, a faculty profes-

sor at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill who teaches and works in the Clinical Research Unit at Raleigh; Dr. Vivian Travis, a faculty member at Winthrop College in Rock Hill and a practicing psychologist who specializes in stress management
