ATLANTA...Mrs. Coretta Scott King last week announced that Mrs. Rosalynn Carter will speak at the Ecumenical Service commemorating Dr. King's 51st birthday anniversary on January 15.

Mrs. King, president of The King Center, said that, "We are delighted that Mrs. Carter will be representing the President at our celebration. This will be the second consecutive year that Mrs. Carter has participated in our January program, a fact which bears witness to the administration's recognition of the importance of the non-violent movement led by my husband and the Center's ongoing work on its behalf."

In a related development, Mrs. King said that Mrs. Joan Mondale will also participate in the week-long celebration sponsored by the King Center. Mrs. Mondale will join Ambassador and Mrs. Andrew Young at the King Center's "President's Reception" at 7:30 p.m. Monday, January 14th at the Peachtree Center Plaza Hotel in downtown Atlanta.
