The seminar, which was co-sponsored by the North Carolina Institute of Government in Chapel Hill and the State Youth Council (a component of the N.C. Department of Administration's Youth Involvement Office), was designed to give young people opportunities to learn more about government and how to develop their own lead-

ership skills. The participants attended a number of workshops and panel discussions on justice and youth rights, news media, community organizing and government. At the end of the week-long session, the students received certificates for their participation during a luncheon featuring an address by Howard Lee, secretary of the De-partment of Natural Resources and Community Development.

During the week, the students heard other state officials including Attorney General Rufus Edmisten; Elizabeth Koontx, assistant superintendent of the Department of Public Instruction; Gary Pearce, the Governor's press secretary; Rep. Patricia Hunt; and District Court Judge William Jones of


