Landfill Fee Permit Deadline

The September 1 implementation date for the landfill fee system is only 19 days away and to date, the City has received landfill permit applications for only 183 individual vehicles.

These landfills permit applications, once they are approved and a line of credit is set up, will allow landfill users to enter the landfills as necessary and be billed on a periodic basis by the City for landfill user fees. Without the permit and the line of credit, users will have to pay the landfill user fee at the gate with cash, check or money order.

Over 350 private haulers, many with fleets of trucks, have been contacted by the City with information outlining the procedure to fol-

low to obtain a line of credit, a vehicle fee schedule and a sample vehicle permit form. As credit is approved, these haulers will be issued a permit decal for display on each vehicle using the landfill.

Those landfill users who have applied for landfill user permits need to follow up their applications.

New Register Of Deeds Fee Announced

The Mecklenburg County Register of Deeds Office has raised its fee scale in order to comply with a new State law requiring changes in the uniform statewide fee schedule.

The new fee schedule, as adopted by the N.C. General Assembly is as follows:

--For instruments in general, such as real estate documents, corporate charters, limited or general partnerships, or assumed name certificates, the fee is \$4 for the first page and \$1.50 for each additional page.

--For plats, including maps, plats, and condominium plans, the recording fee is \$12.50, plus a \$3 fee for furnishing a certified copy of a plat.

--For delayed birth certificates, one year or more after birth, the registration fee is \$10.

--To make an amendment to a birth or death record, the fee is \$2.

--For legitimations, concerning an illegitimate child's birth certificate record, the fee is \$7.

--For certified copies of birth and death certificates, and marriage licenses, the fee is now \$3.

--The fee for furnishing a certified copy is \$3.

--For comparing a copy for certification, when the

copy is furnished by the person filing the document, the fee is \$2.

--For administering the oaths of office to a notary public, the fee is \$5.

--For filing reinstatements of articles of incorporation, the new fee is \$4.

YWCA Offers Business Packet

A pilot program designed to take the YWCA fitness program to the business community is underway, according to Gwyn Ulasiewicz, Trade Street Center Program Director.

The "Corporate Business" packet is designed to meet the physical fitness needs of employees of large businesses.

"Corporations have expressed interest in this concept, since there is a rising interest in employee fitness - fit employees are happier, healthier, more productive persons. We feel that many corporations could provide a much less expensive program through our services than were they to provide their own equipment and instructors. We point out that establishment of such a program can often mean a

reduction in their health insurance rates also," said Mrs. Ulasiewicz.

The demonstration, presented to date to both Gold Bond and Belk Services, consists of an eleven minute physical demonstration (dancercise, jump rope, etc. - all done to music) followed by a question and answer session.

Mrs. Ulasiewicz and Tenley Andrews demonstrate the routines, while Trade Street Center Director Celesta McCullough explains the basics of the YWCA and the Corporate Business Physical Fitness package.

The plan calls for fee sharing - and as the YW is taking the instruction to the

community, membership in the YW is not mandatory for participation of the employees in the program.

"We also hope that this will generate interest in other programs at the YW and become a natural tie-in with our "Working Women's Special," which is a continuous exercise program for a half hour, designed for the working woman during her lunch hour, concluded Mrs. Ulasiewicz.

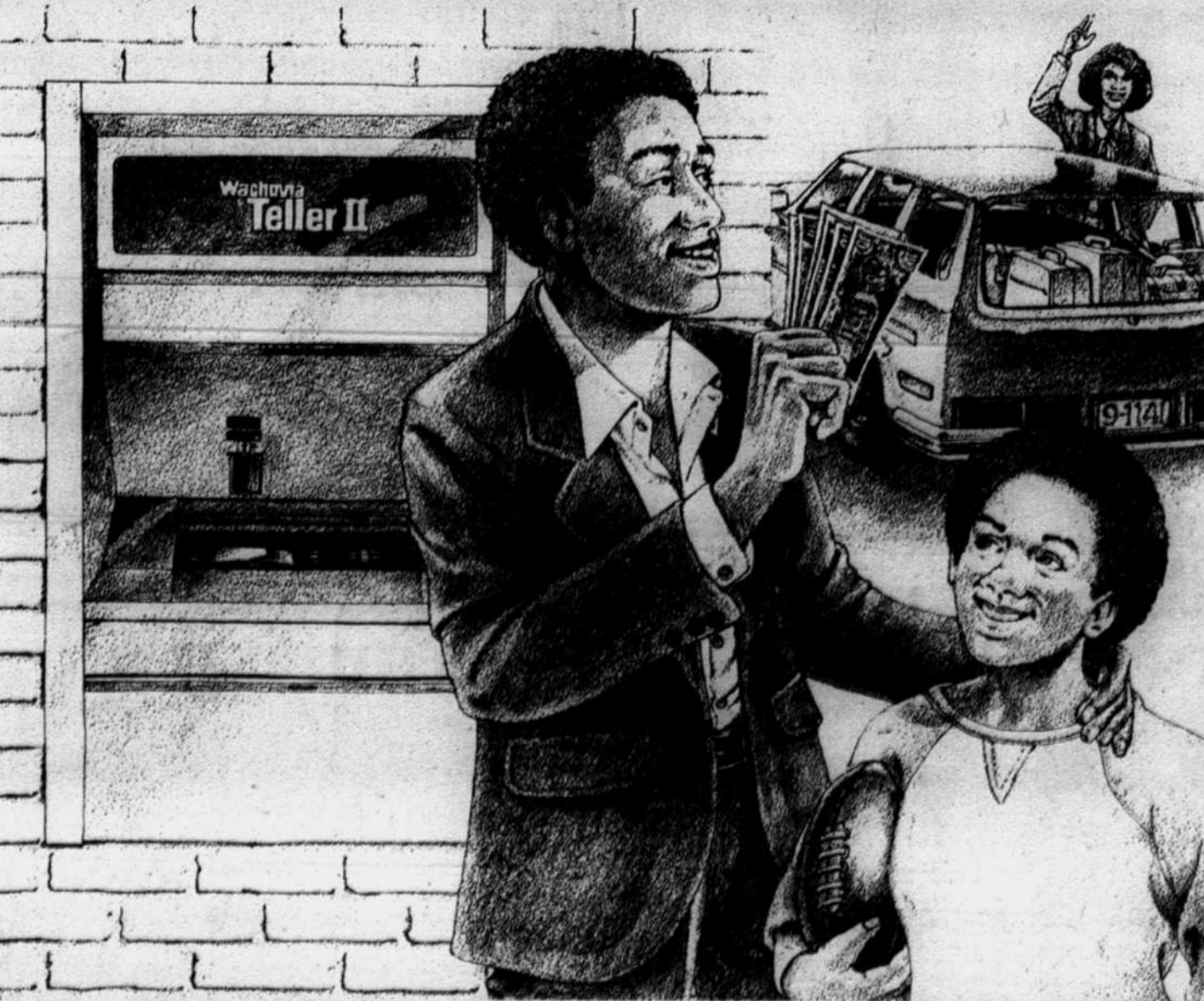
Aerobic classes will be given on the hour, trim gym on the half hour in both the day and evening programs. There will be 20-25 minutes of exercise with a question and answer session following.
