Steve Broadus Griffin is very pleased and excited about being named to the North Carolina Shrine Bowl squad.

The South Mecklenburg Sabre star, who considers as his best game the affair between highly touted Kanapolis A. L. Brown on the road in which he scored three times and ran for over 206 yards, is con-

South Mecklenburg's Kelvin Crooms was named to the Shrine Bowl team as a linebacker but he is reknown in these parts from his running back position. Number 34 for the South Mecklenburg Sabres gained 1,358 yards and scored 19 touchdowns in leading the Sabres to the state championship game. The All-County linebacker is 6' and weighs 200 pounds.

North Mecklenburg's Raymond Phillips is the best all around athlete on the Viking team. Making All-County for the second year, he is a tight end, defensive end and on the kickoff team. he is 6'4" and 210 pounds.

"We have been playing together for a while. My sophomore year we were 2-8. My junior year we were 7-3. In this my senior year, we are 14-0.

The Sabres' number 44 is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Broadus Griffin of Clanton Road in the Clanton Park neighborhood of southwest Charlotte.

The 5'11", 165-pound athlete is the 1981 Associated Press "Football Player of the Year."

Making All-County for the second year, his accomplishments include: 2,282 yards and 28 touchdowns.

The running back was most valuable in football last year and has been named as one of South's outstanding athletes.

Music and running are hobbies for the member of St. Mark United Methodist Church.

What does he plan to pursue in college? "I am considering the possibility of majoring in business administration," said the speedster who has been selected three times as the Charlotte Post "Football Player of the Week" for his accomplishments and was named to the Charlotte Post Offensive Eleven and as the "Offensive Player of the Year" by the Charlotte Post.
