Most Pensions Require Special Tax Treatment

GREENSBORO - A person receiving a pension or annuity should be sure of the tax status of that income, the Internal Revenue Service says.

A pension to which an employee contributed nothing during his or her employment is fully taxable and must be reported on the Form 1040, even if expenses are not itemized by the taxpayer on Schedule A and B.

However, that portion of the pension to which the employer and employee contributed, while not fully taxable, is partially taxable and is subject to special tax reporting, the IRS said.

If a retiree will recover his or her total contributions within 36 months after the first payment is received, then the annuity payments are not taxes until the contributions are recovered. This is because the contributions were taxed while the person was employed. Those who will not recover their contributions within a 36-month period are entitled to exclude from taxable income a certain percentage of their pensions each year. Normally, the issuer of the pension will compute the

exclusion percentage. If the issuer of the pension does not compute this percentage, instructions can be found in IRS Publication 575, "Pension and Annuity Income," available free from the IRS.
