Continued from Page 1 out, Ms. Lynch said.

Ms. Lynch confirmed that cooperation between black and white political leaders is an increasingly important element in local politics. "Tom Ray is on the county commission because of black voters," Ms. Lynch commented, in explaining how black votes can be crucial to white as well as black candidates.

(According to most political observers, C. W. Kidd, the leader by a wide margin in the voting for sheriff, is another example of a white politician who benefitted substantially from black votes.)

The Black Political Caucus, Ms. Lynch pointed out, endorsed black and white candidates and worked with FAIR, a women's group, to elect a Senate slate.

Local black groups such as the Voter Task Force are working to achieve a black turnout of 25,000 in Mecklenburg County in November, Ms. Lynch revealed. A black vote of this size would make "a considerable difference" to a number of local candidates, both black and white, she asserted.






