The choir, under the leadership of Geraldine Dykes Daniel, will have an unveiling and dedication of a plaque commemorating the induction of the Gospel-Spiritual Hall of Fame Artists including Annie Rose Poole and many local misicians.

The Hall of Fame was established in 1981 to show appreciation for the musicians in the Charlotte area who have demonstrated exceptional dedication to Gospel and Spiritual music. At the annual concert in 1983, disc jockey Robert Harris of radio station WPEG and Bill Johnson of The Charlotte Post were honored for their loyalty and support for Gospel and Spiritual music in the Charlotte area.

She organized the Spiritual Choir at St. Paul Baptist Church where she is now assistant music director under the leadership of pastor Dr. Paul W. Drum-

Former baseball player Jackie Robinson was so taken by Mrs. Poole that he arranged for her to appear at the Appollo Theatre and Carnegie Hall in New York City. It was fulfilled through Kelly Alexander, Sr., chairman of the Na-


