

Continued From Page 1A and there are fresh goals to meet.

In 1884, the Little Hope community, known today as Clawson Village, was a quiet, rural neighbor to Charlotte. The people worked the land and did the best they could with what they had. There was little to spare in money or energy. But, there was a need - a church where the people could hear God's Word and share in free fellowship with one another, teaching their children and helping each other. So, the first goal was set, and a church for the community was organized, including members of the Clawson, Ingram, Cuthbertson, Ray, Steward, Weldon, Pettis, and later the Brown families. As the years progressed and the community grew, the membership of the church increased. In the early 1900's, the White, Richardson, Means, Givens, McCoy, Monroe, Beaver, McKinney, Reeves, and Boyd families, and others whose names are unavailable, affiliated with the Little Hope Church. Bishop I. C. Clinton appointed Rev. John Stitt to serve as the first pastor and Presiding Elder Harris was the Elder.

The first services were held in a "brush arbor" which was an open-air canopy of branches which offered protection from the sun but little else. For almost a year, the small congregation worshipped under the brush arbor until December, 1884, when Mr. William Ingram donated an acre of his land on which to build a church.

Working nights and whenever they could make the time, the men of the church - assisted by two neighbors who owned a sawmill and knew carpentry - cut logs, hauled materials and erected their own building. On the night construction was finished, the sounds of singing and praise told the church family that another goal had been met; the church had a home.
