"Backstreet" is the eighth Warner Bros. album by one of the most respected and creatively charged artists in modern music-David Sanborn.

The eight selections on the album represent something of a departure for the extraordinary saxophonist. It's music bristling with pop and R&B savvy, blended brilliantly into Sanborn's own well-defined jazz brew.

His musical passion goes back to grade school when he began studying alto saxophone. Sanborn started playing rhythm and blues gigs around his native St. Louis, frequenting down-town clubs where he would listen and sit in.

"My musical roots go back to the R&B I heard in those clubs," Sanborn recalled. "I also was greatly influenced by Hank Crawford and the old Ray Charles band." Sanborn studied music theory more formally at Northwestern University and later at University of Iowa.

A visit to San Francisco in '67 resulted in his joining

the Paul Butterfield Blues Band just as Butterfield was introducing brass into the group's sound. He remained with Butterfield for four years, contributing a much-acclaimed solo on e title cut of Sanborn's "In My Own Dream" LP. Sanborn has also worked with Stevie Wonder, Paul Simon, James Taylor, David

Bowie, James Brown, The Eagles, Bruce Springsteen, Dan Fogelberg, and most recently, Roger Waters, and the Rolling Stones. Sanborn will be in
