The workshops are as follows:

June 14: "What's Going On In El Salvador?" A discussion of the local implications, led by Kathy Sparrow of the Carolina Interfaith Task Force. Maximum enrollment, 25, minimum, 15. (7:30 - 9:30 p.m.)

June 28: "Holistic Health-care as a Treatment Modality for Living With Premenstrual Syndrome." Berkeley Reynolds, a nutritional consultant will lead this discussion. Muscle testing will be conducted. Maximum enrollment, 8; minimum, 1. (7 - 8:15 p.m.)

July 10: "Family Tree." Dr. Rosalyn Jacobs Jones will discuss methods and easy techniques on how to trace and collect family memorabilia. Maximum enrollment, 15; minimum 8. (12:15 p.m. - 2 p.m.)

Improvement To Statesville Avenue Aired

RALEIGH - Charlotte residents will have an opportunity to discuss state Department of Transportation (NCDOT) plans to widen a section of Statesville Avenue at a public meeting on June 14.

The informal open-forum meeting runs from 1 to 6 p.m. in the J.T. Williams High School Media Center located at 2400 Carmine Street in Charlotte.

NCDOT representatives will be at the meeting to discuss the proposed project which is included in the department's 1984-1993 Transportation (TIP).

The proposed project calls for Statesville Avenue to be widened from Newland Road to I-85.

Construction of the eight-tenths-mile project is expected to start in fiscal year 1986 and according to information contained in the TIP will cost about \$1.5 million.

The public is invited to attend, ask questions, make comments, suggestions or recommendations pertaining to the project.

Street Improvements

Starting Friday, June 15, Fourth Street and Randolph Road between Independence Boulevard and Laurel Avenue will be repaved. Traffic will be maintained during the project.

Before paving begins, excess asphalt will be removed from the street gutters to provide better drainage and a more comfortable ride. This work will be performed starting June 15 and will continue during the weekend.

Following this work, all manhole covers will be raised on the one mile portion of Fourth Street and Randolph Road. Resurfacing will follow and should be complete by the weekend weather permitting.

The \$54,000 project is coordinated by the City's Street Maintenance Division. Most of the money comes from the Powell Bill Fund, state gas tax revenue.

# Geology Workshop Set

School teachers who want to learn more about the geology and the geologic history of Piedmont North Carolina will have an opportunity at a workshop June 25-29 at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, funded by an \$8,600 grant from the Martin Marietta Company.

The program is specifically designed for teachers who in 1984-85 will be teaching general science courses which include earth science as well as life and physical science topics.

Opportunities will be provided to study the Carolina Slate Belt and the Charlotte Belt geologic formations and to visit quarries in Charlotte and Monroe. Water resources and their management will also be studied.

Faculty will be Dr. Gail Gibson and Dr. Don Steila of the UNCC Department of Geography and Earth Sciences, assisted by Steve Teeter.

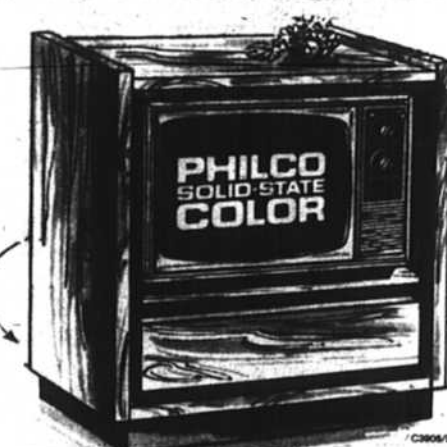

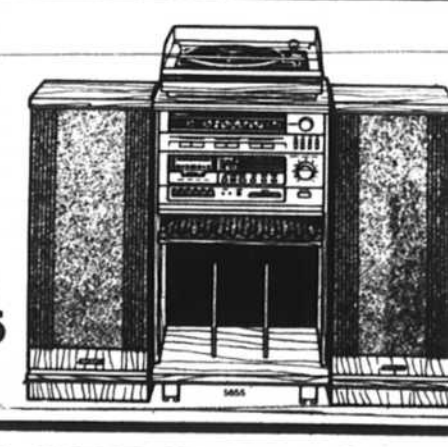

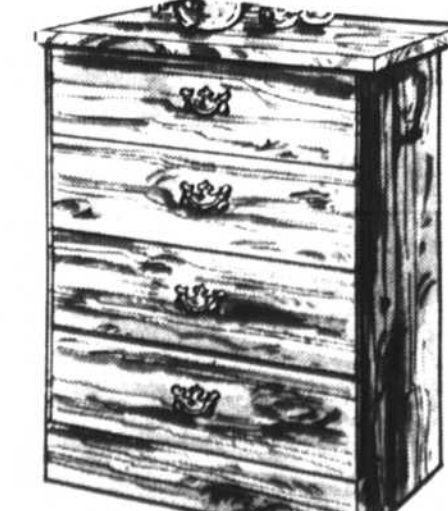
