paying rent.

What you must bring when applying: You must have your Social Security number. Verification of income for the month of October is necessary. (Whether or not one receives the grant depends on the salary of the month of October only.) You must also bring award letters or check stubs based on October's salary. Food Stamp recipients should apply at the Youth Council office.

When will the money be issued?: Checks will be mailed to eligible recipients in February of 1985. They will be based upon the income; source of energy; and the region.

Supposed you are turned down? You will receive a letter within two weeks stating that you have been denied the aid. You do, however, have the right to appeal.
