The University of North Carolina at Charlotte will host the state's 1985 "History Day" contest Saturday, April 27, from 9 a.m. until 2:30 p.m. in Cone University Center.

Dr. Robert Rieke, UNCC history professor and state coordinator for "History Day," said approximately 180 students in grades six through 12 are expected to enter the contest, which has as its theme this year "Triumph and Tragedies in History."

Contestants will be the winners and first runners-up from the state's eight district contests held earlier this year. State winners and first runners-up will be eligible to attend the national history contest June 11-14 in Washington, D.C.

Students may enter projects in one of four categories: historical papers, projects, performances or media presentations. Topics for this year's entries include the Roanoke voyage, D-Day, the Battle of Kings 'Mountain, and the diary of Anne Frank.
