

WSOC-TV Will Present "Lace II" In Two Parts

"Lace II," the continuation of last year's runaway hit movie, will be presented in two parts, Sunday, May 5, and Monday, May 6, at 9 p.m. on WSOC-TV, Channel 9.

The two parts will air as Special Presentations of "The ABC Sunday Night Movie" and "The ABC Monday Night Movie."

"Lace II" stars Brooke Adams, Arielle Dombasle and Deborah Raffin (both Adams and Dombasle are returning to their roles from the original "Lace") with Phoebe Cates again starred as Lili, who is now racing against a literal deadline to discover which of three famous men - an American astronaut, a distinguished European conductor, or an Arab King - is her real father.

Anthony Higgins returns as King Abdullah of Sydon, along with James Read and Patrick Ryecart, who play the other two mysterious men who might be Lili's father. Christopher Cazenove ("Heat and Dust") is a leader of the rebel band which kidnaps Lili's mother, and Michael Fitzpatrick is the young man everyone has always believed to be Lili's father.

In "Lace II," Lili (Phoebe Cates) and her mother Judy (Deborah Raffin), have just begun to explore the mother-daughter relationship they missed. Then Judy is kidnapped by the rebels in a war-torn country.

Lili, who has been systematically cheated and robbed throughout her movie career, has no money. In desperation, she turns to Judy's closest friends - Pagan (Brooke Adams) and Maxine (Arielle Dombasle).

Their only hope is to find Lili's father and plead with him - or blackmail him - for the money.

The problem: the man they all believed to be her father was physically incapable of fathering a child. Their only clue to the truth is a book Judy wrote while she was pregnant with Lili. Next problem: the book describes three rapes - only one of which really happened.

Is it true that Abdullah (Anthony Higgins) assaulted Judy after he was rejected by Pagan,

making Lili the daughter of an Arab king? Or was the rapist Werner Graff (Patrick Ryecart), the sullen youth who has since become a renowned conductor?

Or was Judy raped in her hometown during the school break, on a hayride with Daryl Webster

(James Read), who is now a much-decorated American astronaut?

Which story is true?

While Lili, Pagan and Maxine are individually threatening the three possible fathers in an effort to raise the ransom, Judy is discovering - to her horror that she is becoming

attracted to Raleigh (Christopher Cazenove), the arrogantly handsome rebel leader who holds her captive.

If the father does not admit to Lili's paternity, the ransom money cannot be paid. If the ransom is not paid, Raleigh - no matter what his personal

feelings - will execute Judy "for the good of the revolution."

And none of the three men will confess to the rape.

"Lace II" will air on WSOC-TV, Channel 9 Sunday, May 5 and Monday, May 6 from 9 - 11 p.m.
