Does A Woman Need A

Why should a woman have a will? For all the reasons that anyone reasons that anyone needs a will, so that your property is distributed the way you wish it to be. If a woman is married, she may hold some property jointly with her husband and some in her own name alone. The obligation to make a decision about distribution of property remains whether one is mar-ried or single, Moreover, if there are children, you will want to express your preference about who will be the guardian in the event of the death of both parents.

Should you wait until you reach a certain age to make will? The answer is no. Life is uncertain and not everyone dies of old age. A married woman should give consideration to drawing a will which may bear on the terms of the will drawn by her husband. Each of them should consider the possibility that they could die in a common dis-aster and provide for that possibili-ty. Do not fail to provide for children who may be born after the will is signed. Husbands may wish to include a clause to cover outside children, who may claim him as father. Will drawing time is the time to be realistic and to cover all bases. It is possible that wife or husband will wish to keep the terms of her, or his, will secret from the other. This is possible since your lawyer cannot ethically reveal anything which you reveal in confidence to him or her. If you decide to make a will and keep it

you decide to make a will and keep it secret from your spouse, be sure to ask your attorney how to deal with jointly-held property.

This is not a "how to" column. This writer recommends that you consult your attorney.

For single women, many of the above-mentioned problems do not arise. Simply list all those people whom you wish to benefit and the amount of kind of property they are to receive. Select a responsible person (fiduciary) to carry out your wishes and specify the kind of bond the person should be under. If there are persons who would normally expect to inherit and you wish to

exclude them, it is better to mention the person by name. For example: I have not left anything to my oldest son, Tim, because he is financially secure; or, I have in-tentionally excluded my nephew, John. This recital is to prevent a claim that you forgot to mention the

If you die with a will (intestate) your property goes to your relatives according to something

called the laws of descent and distribution. This is frequently not the way the testator (you) intended. Long absent spouses often turn up to claim property when a person dies without a will.

You may want to leave everything to your spouse and trust to him to look after your children; or, you may think it better to make the division between your spouse and children in the will. Why leave anything to chance when it is so simple to reduce your wishes to writing?
