State Approves After-School Program

The nine CMS after-school enrichment programs that have been operating since September have been granted state approval by the Office of Child Day Care of the Department of Human Resources.

The state gave its approval to the programs after a day care specialist inspected each site. The programs were evaluated in a number of areas including building, sanitation and safety standards, staff qualifications, teacher-child ratios and activities.

"State approval is important because we want the community to be assured that their children are getting the highest quality of care and that our programs are meeting or exceeding the standards of any other day care facility here," says Barbara Keelan, coordinator of the after-school enrichment programs. State approval also clears the way for Child Care Resources, Inc., a non-profit agency, to place children from low-income families

whose care is subsidized by state funds in CMS programs.

The nine programs granted state approval are located at Devonshire, Dilworth, Hidden Valley, Irwin Avenue, Lansdowne, Long Creek, Nations Ford, Newell and Oakhurst Elementary Schools. On November 12, the School Board approved another program at Selwyn Elementary, which began operation on Monday, November 18. Keelan says she also will seek state approval for that site.

The after-school programs provide care for children in kindergarten through sixth grade. The fee is \$20 per week. The programs are staffed by certified teachers and by teacher assistants. For more in-

There is no denying that Black America needs more doctors but oftentimes there are roadblocks in the path of those striving to make it to and through medical school. Well, in my travels, I have learned of a program that may help to overcome some of the problems. It's the *Medical Opportunity for Competitive Minority Students*.

Medical Opportunity for Competitive Minority Students is a facet of the Bowman Gray School of Medicine of Wake Forest University. This is not a giveaway program. There are some requirements such as a minimum of 90 undergraduate semester hours, with 8 semester hours each in general biology, general chemistry, organic chemistry, and physics considered as minimum science preparation. Each applicant must take the Medical College Admission Test that is sponsored by the Association of American Medical Colleges. The MCAT is given twice a year in the fall and in the spring. Applicants are encouraged to take the test in the spring so that the test can be taken again in the fall should an improved score be needed.

Financial aid through loans, or other forms of assistance, is available to students who would not otherwise attend medical school.
