"You can not make it by studying for an hour each night and make it. You can not blow your mind on coke and crack and make it. . .. You live by the consequences of your choices," Jackson said.

Jackson also asked the crowd to stand if they knew anyone in their age group who had died from drugs, used drugs, jailed be-cause of drugs or sold drugs. There weren't many who stayed seated.

He also asked those who had tried drugs to come forward. There were even fewer people who stayed seated. He then lead them in a prayer-like pledge in

which the students pledge to ex-cel in education, obey their par-ents and stay away from drugs.

Jackson asked all the students to sign a pledge with Push-Excel that they would study for at least 2 hours per night with no tv or radio, abstain from drugs and alcohol and would not become or make anyone a teenage par-

At apress conference following the rally, Jackson said he was not surprised with the number of students who came forward.

"I see it everywhere I go, " he said. 'This drug crisis, this use of drugs to cover up a vacuum in our souls, is beginning to grasp our youth.



Post Staff Writer People affiliated with Garing-er and West Charlotte high schools are hoping Friday's football game will go off more smoothly than last season's.


The last time the two teams met, four people were wounded in a shooting that brought into focus the dilemma of firearms in local schools.
