breakfast at the McCrorey YMCA, then take his sons to see King Day parade. "It's a regular thing," he said. "I try to catch it every year."


Eaves is not only president of the Northeast Community Organization, but is a member of League of Women Voters, Charlotte Women's Political Caucus and the Black Political Caucus. She has also chaired her precinct, No. 60.

King was an assertive and aggressive person, Eaves said. "He liked to **empower people.** That's one of my goals, to empower people. I think folks can do a whole lot by being empowered," she said. Eaves worries about

whether King's dream will ever be realized.

"There is too much hatred. We just have to continue to try. You see how affirmative action is. Folks don't care. The Republicans don't care about the poor. There will be poor folks forever. We have to think about them and worry about them. "We have come a long

way, but we have got to go a long way. We have got to work with our own people. A lot of us can't work with each other. White and black can't accept who we are. Until we do, we are never going to be able to achieve anything."
