• January 15
King is born in
Atlanta, Georgia, to
Rev. and Mrs. Martin
Luther King Sr.

1948

February 25
King is ordained to the Baptist ministry.
June

King graduates from Morehouse College with a B.A. in sociology.

• September

King enters Crozer Theological Seminary and, after hearing sermons on the life and teachings of Mohandas Gandhi, begins to study Gandhi and his philosophy.

1953

• June 18
King marries Corerta
Scott in Marion,
Alabama.

1954

• May 17
The Supreme Court, in
Brown v. Board of
Education, rules segregation in public
schools unconstitutional.

• October 31
King is installed as pastor of Dexter
Avenue Church in
M o n t g o m e r y,

1955

• June 5

Alabama.

King receives doctoral degree in Systematic Theology from Boston University.

• December 1

In Montgomery, Rosa Parks refuses to relinquish her bus seat to a white man and is arrested. This incident touches off a massive bus boycott, led by King as president of the Montgomery I m p r o v e m e n t Association.

1956

• February 21

After suffering other legal harassments and personal threats, King is indicted in the boy-

cott on charges of conspiracy against a business without "just or legal cause."

• November 13 The Supreme Court upholds a lower court decision declaring unconstitutional Alabama's laws requiring segregation on buses.

• December 21 Montgomery buses are integrated.

1957

• February

The Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) is founded. King is elected president, and shortly thereafter Time Magazine puts him on its cover.

• September

President Dwight Eisenhower federalizes the Arkansas National Guard to escort nine black students to an all-white high school in Little Rock. The first civil rights act since Reconstruction is passed by Congress.
