"The People's Biographer" is for everyone. Whether or not a person thinks their life story is important, they should reflect on their life experiences and let their voice be heard.

"It may seem as if young adults are not listening to their parents or grandparents, but they actually are and they learn a lot from them, Bullock said.

Bullock says that it is impor-tant for parents and grand-parents to share their history. Those who can not remember their past are condemned to repeat it," according to Ralph Waldo Emerson.

The book is filled with questions expanding from a persons birth, childhood, early teens, immediate ancestors, biological families.

"After compiling their information a person can contact the company to have their hisplaced in a hard back cover," Bullock said.


