Church volunteers serve school

DECATUR, Ill. — The second day of school was hectic enough for Washington Elementary School Principal Toni Nale before the sad-faced 12-year-old in the Chicago Bulls T-shirt showed up in her office.

On the verge of tears, he begged Nale to let him return to her school, not the one he transferred to after his mother moved across town this summer. At Washington, he had begun turning away from the lure of the streets that kept getting him into trouble, and the prospect of going to a new school was earthshaking.

The Rev. Eugene Green arrived just after Nale had called the boy's probation officer to take the child back to the school he had skipped.

It was the first day of the One Church, One School project in Decatur, a plan to have

local churches "adopt" a public school and provide volunteers to help children. Green was there to work as a mentor and role model for students like the boy in the Bulls shirt.

"How would you like to know that you have someone in your corner?" Green asked in a quiet voice as Nale held the boy's quivering arm. "How

would you like to have someone who cares about you, to talk about your problems? Would you let me be that person?"

The boy in the Bulls shirt was skeptical. "I dunno," he said in a barely audible quaver as he stared at his hands.
