"The board will increase its sensitivity to the concerns of the community. The board will be extremely fair in its deliberations of employee hearings. The honesty of this board will be impeccable."

The civil service board is

charged with insuring that hiring and promotion of police and fire employees is done solely on "fitness, competency and merit," rather than political, economic or social influence.

Police and fire personnel can appeal disciplinary actions, including dismissals, taken by supervisors to the board.


