
Union. The banquet will not only present a scholarship, but recognizes individuals who have given to the fund.

on to be one of the state's top black lawyers before dying in 1895. Elliott was considered the finest orator among the South's black leadership. A lawyer with his own firm in Orangeburg, he spent two terms in Congress before he was elected to the state House in 1874. He served as speaker until 1877.
